### WHO IS SPANGLISH FLY?



SPANGLISH FLY originated in 2009 when DJ Jonny Semi-Colon (Jonathan Goldman) started noticing that amid his sets of old-school funk and soul vinyl, what really shook the dance floor was Latin boogaloo, late-60s records by Joe Cuba, Joe Bataan, Mongo Santamaria, etc.

. He knew he had to form a band to play the music live. Soon, SPANGLISH FLY was dazzling audiences at NYC venues such as the Apollo, the Blue Note, BB King's, SOB's, and Brooklyn Bowl, including opening for boogaloo legends Joe Bataan and Johnny Colón. Over the years, the band has toured the US east coast, bringing the party to festivals such as Charlotte's Latin American Fest and Massachusetts' Green River Festival, and to arts institutions such as the Kennedy Center in Washington DC and Lincoln Center in NY. Recording for the labels Electric Cowbell and Chaco World Music, they have worked with Harvey Averne (legendary Fania producer of Eddie Palmieri, Machito), Adrian Quesada (Grupo Fantasma, Brownout).

SPANGLISH FLY's new album, Ay Que Boogaloo! (Chaco World Music) sees the band continuing to use boogaloo as a musical foundation while taking the genre in new and unexpected directions, incorporating bolero, New Orleans funk, swing jazz, Arabic chant, and other new sounds. It highlights the double-lead-vocals of Mariella Gonzalez and Paloma Muñoz, and boasts guest appearances by Latin music luminaries Joe Bataan, Snowboy, Flaco Navaja, El Callegueso, Izzy Sanabria and other special guests. In his liner notes, Bobby Sanabria calls the record "a combination of great musicianship, clever songwriting, and slick arranging. And guess what Pilgrims? You can dance to it too!"

### **ABOUT NEW SWING SEXTET**



Imagine a hot salsa band from the 1960s reuniting after a 25year hiatus to discover an even greater, more global, fan base. "Rip Van Winkle couldn't have had it better," recalls cobandleader George Rodriguez of the New Swing Sextet's (NSS) recaptured infectious popularity.

"No one is more surprised than we are," says the vibist and original NSS member, "to be 'Back on the Streets'." A product of New York City and the excitement and turbulence of the sixties, the New Swing Sextet made its professional debut performing in the Singer Bowl at the last New York Worlds Fair in 1965. The band has been a popular and innovative exponent of Latin jazz, salsa and pop music for over five decades. With a long history of making music on the streets of Latin New York through harmonized vocals, piano, vibes, bass and Latin percussion, NSS recorded the last of 4 albums, all under the Cotique label, in 1970 and broke up in the late seventies. The band offers the classic Latin New York sound of another era, perfectly preserved and bottled for today's global salsa enthusiasts.

The New Swing Sextet features George Rodriguez on vibes and vocals; co-leader, Angel Justiniano on vocals and conga drums; his younger brother Harry Justiniano on bass and vocals; Hector Ortiz on bongos and latin percussion; Jimmy Figueroa on timbales and vocals; Conal Fowkes on piano and the vocal stylings of Orlando Ortiz on lead vocals.

### **ABOUT JOE BATAAN**



Boogaloo, Latin Soul, Rhythm and Blues, Salsa, Disco, Latin Funk, Latin R&B Latin Jazz, Rap .... What didn't Joe Bataan sing? Joe Bataan was born and raised in Spanish Harlem (East Side of Manhattan New York) in 1942 to an African-American mother and Filipino father. His given name is Bataan Nitollano. 60's, "Latin Soul" was officially born by the creator Joe Bataan.

His musical experience started in the street corner singing dowops in the 1950's. During his teenage years, Bataan associated himself with street gangs. At the age of 15 he spent five years at Coxsackie State Prison for riding in a stolen vehicle. It is unknown if he was the driver of the stolen vehicle. In prison he learned music and six months after his release, he began to record music. Bataan visualized an incredible vision that perhaps several recording artist may have said it is impossible to do. His visual modality was to combine Latin music with Rhythm and Blues. As a result of this merger, Joe Bataan became known as the first recording artist to create authentically Latin Soul music. Although Latin Soul existed in the past before Joe Bataan 's merger, however these recording artists were actually Boogaloo singers. They sang English lyrics in a soulful doowop style along with Boogaloo music. Hector Rivera is one example with his Boogaloo hits in 1966 " I wanna a chance for romance " " At The Party" and " Drown my heart " Mr. Bataan didn't coin the phrase "Latin Soul" The phrase was used in the early 60's and perhaps late 1950's with La Lupe and Tito Puente. Mr. Bataan actually created the music as it should have sounded. By merging Latin music with R&B tunes in the late 60's, "Latin Soul" was officially born by the creator Joe Bataan.

He found his love of Salsa in 2001, having been taken to a class by a co-worker and has not looked back since. His dancing career began under the guidance of Eddie & Maria Torres. He has trained with some of the best in the business, including Eddie & Maria Torres.



He has taught at several dance studios and at prestigious universities such as LIU, NYU, Columbia Business School, and Hofstra University. In addition at the New York Int'l Salsa Congress ('07-'12) as well as several countries. Also in corporate settings, such as for the Marriott Group and American Express. He has performed salsa for films, television, festivals, and on stage.

He is currently on faculty teaching classes at the 92Y. Marlon is also a Teaching Artist for the "Dancing Classrooms" program, teaching ballroom dance to kids throughout NYC public schools. He has been teaching Salsa in NY for the past 20 years and is known for his warm smile, amazing lead, and excellent teaching abilities. Through clear teaching and strong fundamentals, he takes people from having two left feet to dancing up a storm while having fun on the dance floor in a relatively short amount time

His goals are to continue teaching, dancing, traveling the world, and positively impacting the lives of others. His motto- Changing lives, one dance at a time!



#### **Jess Ann Nail**

Jes Ann Nail has been dancing since the young age of 3. Ballet, Tap, and Jazz is where she started as a dancer, but later, she focused on gymnastics and competitive cheerleading. Ray is proficient in various styles of Hip Hop and many genres of partner dance as well as solo dances such as Lindy Hop, Salsa, Foxtrot, Ballet, Modern and Jazz to name a few. He has travelled to China, Cuba, Barbados, Sweden, England, Canada, Puerto Rico, Korea and Various states to train, perform and teach. Ray F. Davis sends a huge thank you to his Mentors, dancers, teachers and people who have/continue to influence and cultivate his passion for movement.
